## WHAT DO THEY SAY ABOUT WELL-BEHAVED WOMEN?

Dear Bobbie,

When the president of the Tokyo 2020 Organizing Committee was asked this week about increasing gender diversity on the Japanese Olympic Committee board, his response played into one of the oldest communication myths in existence, "women talk too much."



According to one of Japan's largest newspapers and widely reported (and mocked) elsewhere, former prime minister Yoshiro Mori, said, "On boards with a lot of women, the board meetings take so much time."

Mori evidently doesn't feel this way about ALL women, as he also discussed the Tokyo Organizing Committee of the Olympic and Paralympic Games. "The organizing committee includes about seven women, but they all know how to behave," he said. Oy.

But is Mori speaking the truth? Don't women talk more than men?

- Women use 20,000 words a day compared with 7,000 for the average man
- Women speak talk twice as fast as men.
- Four-year-old girls speak 30 percent more than boys

Spend a little time on the internet on the topic and whoooo you've gone down a rat hole. Which seems appropriate given the "fact" about 4-year-old girls stems from an extrapolation of a study on the proteins associated with language in rat pup brains. (Talking rats are a thing?)

And, the 20,000 words to 7,000 words "fact"? It seems to have originated with a dust jacket blurb for *The Female Brain*, a 2006 book. Professor Mark Lieberman, University of Pennsylvania, tried to find the origin of these statistics but couldn't find anything other than a 1993 marriage guidance booklet using similar stats.

Most of the real scientific guidance seems to indicate that men and women speak about the same amount in most circumstances. Most studies show few differences.

Except when they don't. A <u>New Zealand study</u> of a hundred public meetings showed that on average, men asked three-quarters of the questions, while making up only two-thirds of the audience. Even when the audiences were equally split gender-wise, men still asked almost two-thirds of the questions.
